# Children's & Family Ministry

Yet it was filled with opportunities that God provided to minister to both the children at Roxborough and those in our community through Summer Friends. The theme for this summer was *The Great Adventure*. Outback Jackie (Sarah Denes, TPP ReFUEL Summer Intern) helped the kids see through her own adventures how amazing God is. The kids learned that discipline can be fun through workshops like Karate (Action Karate). Pastor Ray took us on a journey through the life of Moses and helped us see that God is inviting us all into the most amazing adventure of our lives through a relationship with His Son, Jesus. No matter where we are in our lives, I believe God is continually calling us to experience him in deeper and more profound ways than we thought possible.

## MISSIONARY NEWS

### **A PEEK FROM THE PEAK!**

Well, it WAS like I thought it would be, speed-dating during my two weeks here in the Philly area after the training in Baltimore during the early part of August. As a matter of fact I just got back from a meeting with RPC Mission Committee, this Sunday evening, (sorry to have missed you, Amy!) and bringing them up to date on my nearly 30 years of Women's Ministry with Entrust and an update on the current status of the Asian project.

It is exciting times for me in ministry, with more opportunity/requests for the Women-to-Women Ministry Training (WWMT) than we can handle. As I mentioned to the Mission Committee tonight the US Military is a wide-open door with possibilities beyond imagination that I dreamed about with a military chaplain, the husband of one of the women in our Baltimore training. Oh if only I could multiply myself!

We had a wonderful time at our first-ever hub training on the East Coast, in Marriottsville, MD, just outside of Baltimore. The accommodations, we facilitators (who have facilitated in locations around the world), deem Bon Secours the best yet. Next year's training there will be from August 5 – 11, 2018 when we will be offering Facilitating Relational Learning (a co-ed module); Developing a Discerning Heart; and Discovery Bible Study.

Cost for accommodations, training and materials and 3 delicious meals a day is between \$800-\$900, for your planning purposes. Also plan in 20-30 hours of preparatory work that needs to be done before coming.

One comment we heard over and over again is "I thought I was coming for a teacher training type workshop (we only offered Facilitating Relational Learning this year), and never expected the depth of spiritual nourishment we received!"

The registration form will go up on our website <a href="https://www.entrust4.org/wwmtcalendar">www.entrust4.org/wwmtcalendar</a> after the first of the year. I would LOVE to see several women from Roxborough Church there next year.

While I served as an Entrust Certified Lead Facilitator in Maryland, I will be co-facilitating in October the same module (*Facilitating Relational Learning*) in Chiang Mai, Thailand. A hub training in its 4<sup>th</sup> year, established by Barnabas International's women's ministry, with whom we are in partnership.

Their Women's Ministry Director, Debbie Lamp, was formerly the Women's Ministry Directory with Greater Europe Mission, and pioneered the Entrust WWMT with missionary women, after a discussion we had back some 16+ years ago!! Debbie will be the Lead Facilitator with whom I'll be co-facilitating. This will be my first time in Thailand

This is preceded by three weeks in three cities in "my Asian country" (being a creative access country can't mention the name in print) meeting with former graduates, attending a session of their 2<sup>nd</sup> generation training, as well as meeting with potential new participants and strategizing with leadership and a new potential partner, how best to launch our next thrust into Asia.

While there I'll be attending a 3-day conference on the complexities of working in that challenging environment, hosted by a large Christian entity working there. I attended their last bi-annual conference in 2015 and came away quite challenged and impressed by their expertise.

I showed the Mission Committee a short 5" video I produced on the growth of Entrust's Women's Ministry particularly since 2009 when WWMT was official launched. Over 2,500 women have been through our training from over 150 mission agencies, churches and seminary, including many national lay leaders!! And we continue to get more and more requests. Therefore, in the coming years we are working toward establishing another 16 training hubs --- 12 internationally and four additional hubs in the States.

We need part-time workers to help us staff these training hubs and my dream is to see a team of 3-4 women from Roxborough Church begin preparing now to do just that!

As I thanked the Mission Committee of Roxborough Church, let me thank you the readers of this newsletter for your years of faithful prayer and financial support that has allow me to participant in a such an exciting and successful ministry. Without you this would have never happened!!!

## A Word on Worship

This month I bring you an interesting article from Bob Kauflin of Sovereign Grace Music about the import-ance of words in our worship songs. I hope you find it as interesting as I did.

Words are the primary way God has revealed himself to us and relates to us. We use words because God is a speaking God. From the garden of Eden, words have been God's primary means of interacting with us. At Mount Sinai, God met the Israelites with thunder and lightning, thick clouds, and an ear-splitting trumpet blast. Quite the worship experience. But the most significant aspect of that encounter was God giving them the "Ten Words" (Deuteronomy 4:2–12). God has always wanted us to know more of him than can be conveyed through impress-ions, images, or sounds, as powerful as they may be.

David was a skilled musician of profound emotions. But when it came to worshiping God, it was his words, not his music that God chose to preserve for us in Scripture.

When Israel returned from the Babylonian captivity, Ezra sought to reestablish temple worship. So he and the other priests stood on a platform and read "from the Law of God, clearly, and they gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading" (Nehemiah 8:8). God's Word provided the foundation for the repentance, gratefulness, praise, and celebration that followed.

Jesus rebuked the Pharisees and scribes for basing their worship more on traditions of men than on God's commands (Matthew 15:3–9). The early Christians devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching (Acts 2:42). Paul encouraged Timothy to devote himself to the public reading of Scripture and commanded him to "preach the word" (1 Tim. 4:13; 2 Tim. 4:2). We are to "let the word of Christ dwell in [us] richly" as we sing (Colossians 3:16).

God means for words, especially His Word, to be at the heart of our engaging with him.

Words are what we use to define God, ourselves, and our world. Among other things, words tell us how God has acted in history and what God is actually like. Words inform us that we are sinners who deserve the wrath of

God but that Jesus has come to suffer the wrath of God in our place, purchase our forgiveness, and reconcile us to God. Words also tell us that creation was once in harmony with God's will but through our rebellion became subject to decay and futility. We are not evolving into something better but experiencing the damaging effects of the fall until the day when Jesus returns for his bride and makes all things right. Words also enable us to distinguish between experiences rooted in musical emotion or eternal truth.

Worship is more than words, but it's not less than words. Encounters with God are sometimes difficult to define. But wordless worship is not somehow better than worship with words. Worship without words can never communicate objective truth and God is the defining, objective reality in which we live and move. Experiences, whether audibly through music or visually through art, are in large part subjective. The ultimate goal of our worship is not to reach a state of feeling without thinking. And Revelation indicates we'll be using words (without sin!) in the new heavens and earth.

Words enable us to worship God together. Words enable us to think and say the same things together, rooting our unity in the gospel and not simply in a shared experience. A hundred people listening to a song being played can have a hundred different thoughts about what is happening. As my friend Jon Payne has said, "A picture is worth 1000 words. The problem is, the viewer gets to decide what those words are." There will be some variation when we hear/proclaim words together, but there's greater potential for unity in our understanding and expression. It's one of the reasons God has us sing words together and not simply hum, whistle, or use nonsense syllables.

Words complete the act of worship. I can't make this point better than C.S. Lewis, who wrote in Reflections on the Psalms, "But the most obvious fact about praise — whether of God or anything — strangely escaped me. I thought of it in terms of compliment, approval, or the giving of honor. I had never noticed that all enjoyment spontaneously overflows into praise...I think we delight to praise what we enjoy because the praise not merely expresses but completes the enjoyment; it is its appointed consummation." My love for my wife leads me to say something. Again and again and again. I want her and others to know my feelings. So it is in our relationship with God. Worship works its way out into words.

So by all means, let us thank God for music and treasure those times we're dumbstruck as we consider the unparalleled greatness, holiness, beauty, and mercy of God in Jesus Christ. But let's also remember that God redeemed us to "proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light" (1 Pet. 2:9).
